A bell tent is actually one of the oldest forms of outdoor living shelters. They feature a single central pole and are made with a 100% Polyacrylonitrile. These tents are durable, waterproof, and provide a spacious interior for a comfortable glamping experience.

ADVANTAGES OF A BELL TENT

Here are some of the benefits of using these shelters:

- **Spacious.** The main reason why people choose this style of glamping tent is that it offers a whole lot of interior space, enough to rival even the largest of family tents. - **Durable & Waterproof.** Polyacrylonitrile (PAN) fiber, one of the most importantly synthetic fibers, has been widely used because of its good warmth retention and low resistance to light, mildew, etc. This fabric is extremely water-resistant.
- **Warmth.** While this fabric is breathable, it's one of the few fabrics out there that's also keeps warmth. Plus, most bell tents are compatible with a wood stove, which makes it easier to stay warm during the winter.
- **Easy Set-Up.** This style of tent is designed to be easy to set up, even for a solo glamer. In fact, most of these shelters that are under 15 ft (5m) can be pitched by just one person.

CAN YOU LIVE IN A BELL TENT?

If you're interested in living outdoors full-time, a bell tent is certainly an option. People have lived in these shelters around the world for centuries and many still do. They were actually used quite extensively throughout the Crimean War to house soldiers for extended periods of time.

These tents make for an ideal outdoor living shelter because they offer lots of interior space. They are tall enough to stand upright in and can usually be heated in the winter with a portable wood stove.

- Powder-coated metal frame;
- Powder-coated metal connectors;
- Wooden panels for easy floor installation.

To assemble our flooring system you do not need a saw. Just a wrench for bolts.

Air circulation


As our tents with a full flooring system always stand on their own legs and never touch the ground it helps the air circulation and no mold will appear as the floor is always dry.

Wooden floor panels

We have developed wooden floor panels for fast and easy installation. In this case, you don't need to cut any wooden planks and measure anything. Just drop the flooring in the place and that's it.

Powder coated frame

The frame can be left standing outside of season when you are not operating the glampsite. Or you can just take it apart like the tent itself.

1.3. What Is Glamping?

It seems that the words “hiking” and “convenience” lie in completely different planes, and they are not allowed to intersect under any circumstances. But it only seems! Many travelers have already chosen for themselves a relatively new type of outing into nature with all the amenities – glamping. What is it, how much does it cost, and where to go for it – let’s figure it out together.

What does this strange word mean?

The word “glamping” was formed as a result of combining the words glamorous and camping. The concept of “glamping” began to be actively used in 2005 in the UK, and in 2016 it was even included in the Oxford Dictionary.

In fact, glamping is outdoor recreation marked “luxury”: instead of tents and sleeping bags – a cozy dwelling with a soft bed, instead of a toilet under a tree and swimming in the river – a bathroom with all amenities, instead of stew – restaurant dishes. Such a vacation is intended for those who are not averse to living in the bosom of the wild, but at the same time do not want to go hiking, and in general, can afford a top-class vacation even far from civilization. A “tent with amenities” can cost a tidy sum, comparable to staying in a luxury hotel room of some popular global chain. Prices for glamping range from €50 to €1000 per day, although everything can be much more expensive.

And who invented glamping?

Although the concept of “glamping” has been actively used recently, it is believed that the roots of the phenomenon go far back in history – as far as the Middle Ages. The forerunners of glamorous camping can be called visiting settlements of any medieval king. In those days, not just tent camps were built for the rulers, but huge tents, luxuriously decorated and equipped with everything necessary – royal chambers in miniature.

But back to our time. Rumor has it that the real glamping boom began **in the UK after Brexit**. The British increasingly began to choose a comfortable stay in their native natural expanses for trips abroad. In general, in recent years, the number of glamping areas has increased significantly in Europe. Increasingly, wealthy travelers are getting out into nature with all the amenities without sparing money on such trips.

Why is this type of holiday becoming more and more popular?

Because people in the world have more and more work, fuss and money, but there is no more free time. City life, business, technology – all this alienates people from nature while forming a type of person who is rather unadapted to life without amenities. But even such a person from time to time wants to be alone with nature. Glamping is becoming an ideal type of outdoor recreation for people who absolutely cannot imagine their day without a hot bath and do not intend to make a fire by rubbing two sticks. While we wander through the forest and determine by anthills and moss where to place our battered tent, many travelers are willing to pay a lot of money for the opportunity to stay a couple of days in a luxury tent at the end of the world.

Many travel analysts, by the way, are critical of the new trend and believe that glamping is just another way to extract money from wealthy travelers. Indeed, in fact, lovers of such boutique camping pay for completely ordinary and simple things. Well, that is, a cozy bed and a restaurant dinner in nature are cool, but why is it so expensive? Analysts call this the post-consumerism trap – when you are so tired of the cult of things that you want something very simple and sincere. And in the end, you end up in the same suite for a lot of money, only sort of like in more natural and simple circumstances. In addition, the main task of classic camping is leveled here – a return to natural sources. Well, what kind of merger with nature is this, if the glamer didn’t even make a fire himself and didn’t catch fish?

But while critics snort in the direction of glamping, many travelers consider this the only opportunity for them to step back from the bustle of the city. And businessmen justify themselves: the fee for services can be so high because

glamping is still a single and rather exclusive experience. And there will always be those who are willing to generously pay for the experience.

What types of glamping are there?

The most important condition for outdoor recreation to be called glamping, and not ordinary camping, is, as you already understood, convenience. In order for an outdoor home to qualify as glamping, it must have electricity, showers and toilets, 24-hour service, and other products that you will find more in a good hotel than on a hike.

And then the fantasy of the creators of boutique camping is not limited to anything: domes in the mountains, wigwams, Triangles for observing nature, lodges for foresters and lumberjacks, tree houses, bubble rooms in the middle of the forest, and a lot of options to retire with rich in nature.

Well, theoretically everything is clear. So where do you find all these glamping sites?


The biggest resource that brings together a bunch of glamping placements is glamping.com. You can find the perfect luxury tent here on any continent. There are a lot of categories: treehouses, yurts, bungalows, and stuff like that. The prices are quite divine – from €45 per day, for example, for a modest yurt not far from the Spanish Granada. Glamping sites on beaches and in national parks are especially popular on the site.

How promising is Glamping travel industry?

It is very promising: the number of boutique campsites in the world is growing by leaps and bounds, and articles and books are published for businessmen on how to start a business in the field of glamping. 



1.7. Guide

With this instructive video, a technical fact has been established that it is safe and easy to use the GLAMPHOUSE. The steps highlighted have made it easy to assemble the parts needed to create a tent that meets your aesthetic taste. It is also important to note that: The "Glamphouse" team is always open to new ideas and new arrangements on serving the customers better.

Step 1



TENT FLOOR SYSTEM - It all starts with the metal frame, which is put together in several squares, followed by levelling the metal frame of the tent with plastic feet and a laser. The metal frame is powder coated to give durability and reduce the risk of rusting and impact damage. The lower metal frame is connected with unique connectors and galvanized metric screws. This enables fast, simple and, if necessary, reassembly reusable assembly. The terrace or flooring is prepared in panels for easy, quick and convenient installation. The fact that the tents can be installed on different surfaces gives freedom to change the level within a 10 cm range with the plastic feet. If more levelling is needed, it is possible to put wooden or concrete blocks under these plastic legs and to place the tent straight even with a 1-meter difference in level. Given that the tent and floor system does not require foundations, thanks to the 17 support points and the strength of the metal ramp frame, it is relatively easy to obtain a placement parking permit from the city council construction boards. Even in places such as nature reserves and coastal areas.

Step 2



TENT CONNECTING ELEMENTS - After the tent metal frame floor system has been assembled, the upper frame is assembled and connected with braces or connectors. The material of the upper wooden frame of the tent is Scandinavian pine, which is resistant to temperature changes and treated with oil or paint during the manufacturing process. Our product range includes more than 30 different colour shades for the treatment of wooden parts. Glamphouse Connectors/Mounting Brackets ensure very fast assembly and simplify the assembly process. The connectors/brackets and the wooden parts have the necessary screw locations planned and each part has its specific code, both on metal and wooden materials, which can be easily assembled following user instructions. If a part is accidentally lost or broken, it can also be ordered separately. Similarly, metal parts can be selected in any colour at no extra cost.

ADDITIONAL OPTION FOR TENT - We recommend choosing the second floor, which we also see here, because it gives a lot of extra space to be used for additional sleeping places and other additional options.

Step 3



TENT FABRIC - Once the tent floor is assembled and system is created, the fabric is pulled over. Although it may seem from the outside that this is the most complicated part of the whole tent building process, it is this section that takes the least time, as it can be pulled over very quickly. When the fabric is rolled over, it is stretched with battens. Each slat has its code, making assembly easier. The tent fabric is synthetic with UV protection and is also 100% waterproof, with wind resistance tested up to 20 m/s. If the wind force is greater than specified, we recommend placing sandbags and the floor frame or using an anchor system. All of our products have a 5-year warranty, including the fabric, but the lifespan is usually more than 10 years. In addition, the tent has built-in mosquito nets so that you can enjoy peaceful days and nights without worrying about various insects or mosquitoes. Our team has also selected the best and most durable zippers to be both safe and easy to open and close. Inside the tent, special fabric loops are incorporated, behind which the tent fabric is additionally attached, so that it does not flutter in gusts of wind.

Step 4

TENT DESIGN AND LAYOUT - When you enter the tent, you get a very cosy and warm feeling, which is created by the wooden details and the light permeability of the fabric.

TENT WINDOWS - Two fabric closures are incorporated into the windows, which are designed - for safety and also from rain and wind gusts. The black mosquito net has very good transparency, so it does not interfere with enjoying the surrounding natural beauty.

KITCHEN - The tent can be adjusted and furnished according to everyone's needs and wishes. Glamphouse offers ready-made kitchen equipment, which will be a great helper in preparing meals in nature, without worrying about restaurants or cafes. The kitchen is free-standing and made of light wood material, which means that you don't lose a lot of time for assembly and we know very well what kind of guests tend to be in glamping, so if the kitchen is damaged, it is possible to easily exchange it for a new one. Considering the relatively small m², the light design of the kitchen was chosen to visually increase the space. At the beginning of the video, you saw a version of the floor system, which facilitates the connection of communications (water and sewage) by hiding them under the floor panels and frame, because the frame is usually raised by at least 10 cm. On the other hand, holes can be very easily drilled in wooden panels with a crown drill to connect the kitchen itself.


TOILET - You must be wondering what is behind the kitchen wall. This space is usually intended for the bathroom, but it can certainly be used according to the wishes of each client. We offer two types of rooms for the bathroom. In the video, we see a model of two wooden walls, which are wider and can accommodate a bathtub with a shower, a sink with a cabinet and, of course, a pot. But these things are not in the Glamphouse portfolio, because we believe that it is more profitable and easier for any customer to do it with a local construction company. The second module consists of four walls and a ceiling, so it is smaller and more intimate compact. You can view the second module on our website. On the other hand, the connection of communications proceeds in the same way as for the kitchen. Similar to the floor panels, the walls are made of Scandinavian pine and in the form of panels, which allows you to save money on the assembly bill. It was mentioned earlier that these rooms can be used in different ways. For example, if you don't want a kitchen, then you can create two closed bedrooms, all you have to do is order another front wall with a door.

SECOND FLOOR - When we go up to the second floor, we see that there is a very large space for a double bed. This means that in tent can comfortably sleep up to 6 people. The second floor can also be used as a chill sitting area, as the view of your property through these windows will surely be breathtaking. The second floor of the tent has built-in safety railings so that its use is not only convenient but also always safe for everyone.

TERRACE - Most of our tents can have a 1,5 m terrace, but you can always extend it with our unique floor system.





